


**Fairbanks Correctional Center (FCC)  
Introduction for Inmate's Family and Friends**

**SECURE VISITING**

Secure visits occur through a clear partition over a phone. These visits last up to an hour. Please see reverse side for visiting schedule.



- **Prohibited clothing in the secure visiting room:** hats, coats, anything with a hood,



zippered tops, leggings, jackets, sleeveless shirts, short shirts, obscene or provocative slogans/logos, above the knee skirts/shorts, transparent, translucent, low-cut, revealing, provocative, or immodest clothing. Breasts must not be visible.

- **All visitors must present a valid government or tribal photo I.D. card.** Visiting is first-come first-serve for up to eight inmates. Prisoners are allowed one secure visit per assigned visiting day. All visitors are subject to being searched prior to the visit. Up to three people can visit one inmate at a time.
- **Cell phones, cameras, recording devices and other electronic equipment are prohibited** in the secure visiting room. **Nothing** may be carried into the visiting rooms except your locker key. Lockers are available to secure your belongings. Infants are allowed to have a blanket and pacifier. No baby bottles.
- If a prisoner is at an activity such as, recreation, church, class, or with an attorney, there will not be a visit at that time but you may return for a visit later that day.
- **Children under 18 must be accompanied by their parent or legal guardian** at all times, and must be respectful of other visitors. Visits may be terminated if children are unruly or disruptive.
- We have the right to deny visits based on disruptive or inappropriate behavior.





**MONEY**

- IMMEDIATE FAMILY members can leave cash or money orders on a prisoner's account at the FCC front desk **between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday** (except holidays).
- You can send money orders or cashier's checks in the mail. No cash or personal checks. Make sure to include a full name and full return address and abide by all mail rules outlined below.

**MAIL**

- All mail must be sent through the U.S. Post Office. All mail must have a full return address: first and last name, address, City, State and Zip Code. All publications, including magazines, books or newspapers, must be received directly from the publisher or online retailer. No books/magazines will be accepted from individuals via mail or in person. **An inmate may have up to 5 books, 5 magazines or 5 photos per envelope.** Before sending a book, magazine or photos check with the inmate. If more are received than allowed, they will be returned at the inmate's expense. No hardcover books.
- **Prohibited items in the mail:** stickers, glitter (including glitter greeting cards), organic materials, non-paper materials, musical cards, ribbon, perfume, lipstick marks, blank paper, unsigned cards, postage stamps, blank or pre-stamped envelopes, or hand-made greeting cards. If any of these items are included in a package, the whole package will be returned to you.



**PHONE CALLS**

- Inmates cannot receive phone calls. They may only call land lines via the Securus phone system. You can make arrangements to receive a call from this facility by calling Securus at 1-800-844-6591 and setting up an account.
